

Horse Care:

- Feeding horses (hay, grain, supplements)
- Checking and refilling water buckets or automatic waterers
- Mucking stalls and removing soiled bedding
- Cleaning and sweeping barn aisles
- Dumping manure bucket or wheelbarrow
- Turning horses out to pasture or paddocks
- Bringing horses back into the barn
- Picking hooves
- Grooming (brushing, detangling manes/tails)
- Checking for injuries or signs of illness
- Cleaning and sanitizing feed buckets and waterers
- Tack cleaning and conditioning

Horse Health & Maintenance:

- Blanketing
- Administering medication if needed
- Applying fly spray or grooming products
- Holding for the vet, farrier, bodyworker, etc.
- Weighing horses (using weight tape or scales)
- Wrapping legs
- Soaking and/or packing feet
- Basic horse massage
- Administering or applying any therapy treatments

Facility Maintenance:

- Checking fences, gates, and stalls for safety
- Cleaning and organizing tack rooms
- Locating and replacing damaged equipment (halters, buckets, blankets etc.)
- Checking barn ventilation and clearing dust or cobwebs
- Draining and cleaning troughs
- Dragging and leveling arena footing
- Setting up or breaking down riding arena equipment
- Keeping visitor areas tidy (restrooms, lounges)
- Managing trash and recycling bins
- Planting flowers or maintaining landscaping
- Running errands (supply store trips)
- Checking and refilling first-aid kits
- Cleaning out the bottom of the feed bin
- Inspecting tack for damage
- Horse/Barn Laundry

Weather-Related Chores:

- Breaking ice in water troughs during winter
- Blanketing horses in cold weather or removing blankets
- Setting up fans or misters in summer
- Clearing snow from barn entrances or roof

Administrative Tasks:

- Managing/Recording horse records (health, training, feeding, etc.)
- Ordering feed, bedding, supplements or supplies
- Registering or booking clinics, training sessions, or shows
- Organizing barn schedules (turnout, arena use, lessons)
